## MEETING OBJECTIVES

### The Overall Goal of the Program

The Association was formed in 1938 with the express intent, as stated in the By-Laws, “to encourage study of the problems of Obstetrics and Gynecology; to improve the quality of Obstetrical and Gynecological practice both in its Fellows and of all other physicians residing in its territory; to cooperate with other similar organizations, both local and national, in the study and in the management of problems pertaining to Obstetrical and Gynecological practice; to grant recognition for unusual attainment of service in Obstetrical and Gynecological problems by the inclusion in it’s membership, as Fellows, specialists who reside within it’s territory and, as Honorary Fellows, specialists who reside outside it’s boundaries, who may be specialists so elected, and to foster a spirit of comradeship and mutual helpfulness among those included in it’s Fellowship.” This remains a very accurate and complete statement of the goal of our meetings today, and is the overarching principle governing the structure of the academic program.

- Immediate post-partum implanon—preventing rapid repeat pregnancy in teen moms
- The utility of endocervical curettage at the time of colposcopy for low grade cytologic abnormalities—treatment plans and outcomes
- Cervical dysgenesis and vaginal agenesis
- The influence of editorials on the rising cesarean rates in a large private obstetric practice
- Antenatal sexually transmitted infection screening in private and indigent clinics in a community hospital system
- Maternal vitamin D and placenta growth factor as diagnostic tests of early-onset severe preeclampsia
